William Benham Trowbridge, son of Henry B., son of David, son of Daniel, son of David, son of Joseph, son of William, son of Thomas, who was the first of his family to come to America, Thomas was the son of John Trowbridge of Tauton, Somersetshire, England.

William Benham Trowbridge was born April 14, 1815, in Painted Post, N. Y. Married first time to Ellen Jones, Baltimore, Md., in 1839, in Cincinnati, Ohio. Married, second time, 1869 to Jane Ferguson.

William B. went in boyhood with his parents to Westville, Pa., where he grew to manhood. He moved to Jasper County, Illinois, and was engaged in farming near Newton. According to a story repeated by his son, Bailey James, he was on the fire department in St. Louis, and it is believed that he brought the first steam fire engine to St. Louis from Cincinnati, Ohio, and that he drew plans for a firehouse in St. Louis and received commendations for the well drawn plans. His wife Ellen died of cancer in 1862 and is buried in the Bellfontaine Cemetery, St. Louis. He later married Jane Ferguson. *in his later years*
and is buried in Jasper County - Willow Hill

Gideon and Fanny Brintlinger brought their family of 5 children to Illinois, in a covered wagon and settled on a farm near Marea, Ill. Gideon served with an Ohio infantry during the Civil War. He was killed in an accident when his horse ran away. His widow later married Peter Bennet and after his death, Samuel Kepler. There were one son and six daughters in the Brintlinger family. The Bennets had one son and six daughters, also. Mr. Kepler was the father of George Kepler who married Bessie Brintlinger.
