THE DEATH OF JOHN HAMMERLY.—This community was greatly shocked on Wednesday morning, Nov. 23d, to hear of the sudden death of Mr. JOHN HAMMERLY. Mr. H. was on the street late Tuesday evening, apparently in the enjoyment of his usual health. He arose early Wednesday morning, as was his custom, and at six o'clock took his seat at the breakfast table. He was scarcely seated, however, when he fell back and expired before medical aid reached him. Dr. MOTT, who was summoned to his side, pronounced his death the result of heart-disease. Mr. Hammerly had for a number of years been engaged in the butchering business in this town, and was well known to the people of this county, for his activity and business industry. He had his faults, as we all have, but let them be buried in the grave that has so suddenly opened for his remains, and remember only those things that were good and generous in his nature. He was in about the 62d year of his age.

Funeral will take place this (Thursday) afternoon at 3 o'clock.
