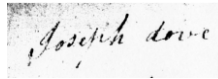

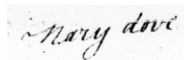

## CHRONOLOGICAL DATE

**1743 Charles County, Maryland** 11 October 1743 – Joseph and Mary Dove witnessed will of Richard Brett of Charles County, Maryland.

**1758 Charles County, Maryland** Found on Tax List for Lower Durham in Charles County, Maryland. This was the birth year of William Dove (Revolutionary War) in Charles County, Maryland.

**1784 Fairfax County, Virginia** 17 November 1784 – John Orr against Joseph Dove, defendant. Case on attachment. The suit is dismissed.

**1784 Fairfax County, Virginia** 25 December 1784 – John Orr against Joseph Dove. Case in on attachment. Joseph Dove didn't come to Court. Orr awarded 20 pounds and his costs. List of what Joseph Dove owned (garnished): One mare, one bed, blanket, one sheet, bed tick and bed cord, one chest, 2 iron potts [sic], one iron wedge, 5 pewter spoons.

**1788 Pittsylvania County, Virginia** 30 March 1788 – Joseph and Mary Dove signed the permission slip for Amily Dove to marry James Hamilton. 2 April 1788 – Marriage bond was issued for this marriage. William Dove was the surety for this marriage bond.

**1798 Pittsylvania County, Virginia** Around first of December 1798 – Aged Joseph Dove began to board with David Hunt (Camden Parish official). “To David Hunt for boarding Joseph Dove 9 months £ 6 15 shillings” The date of the above reference is 2 September 1799; therefore, the date Joseph Dove began boarding with David Hunt is around the first of December 1798.

**1788 Pittsylvania County, Virginia** Marriage Bond - James Hamilton to Amily Dove. William Dove security. Joseph Dove and Mary Dove sign permission note. William [Lewis?] and Jeremiah Sanders witnessed permission note. Joseph Akin's signature was also on the permission note.



219/ In the Name of God Amen I Richard Brett of Charles County in the province of Maryland being sick and Weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testamentary —  
I do recommend my soul to God that gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence it Came to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors and the Worldly Estate that it hath pleased God to Endow me with in the following manner and form —  
Item — I Give and Bequeath to my Beloved Wife Sarah the full third part of my Whole Estate — in part of which is the five following Negroes Vizt. Sambo, Muhameth, Tom, Augustine — and Sarah —  
Item — I Give and Bequeath to my Beloved son Henry three Negroes Vizt. Craigie, Phoenix, Amey and their Increase and the plantation Whereon Snow lies with half the land belonging to me of the said Tract to be Equally Divided by the main branch that runs by the plantation and by a line from the head of said Branch and I Give likewise to my son Henry Two Cows and Calves —  
Item — I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved son John the remaining part of the above mentioned Tract of land and also a Tract Called Bicks Recovery and the three following Negroes Vizt. Pops, Prince and Pegg and their Increase and Two Cows and Calves —  
Item — I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Daughter Anne the three Negroes following Vizt. Jean, Gels and Cattie and their Increase and Two Cows and Calves and it is also my Will that my Brother Geo. Brett do acknowledge unto my said Daughter that Land Mary Johnson lives on according to his Bond for the same —  
Item — I Give unto John Thompson Two years Rent of the plantation he now lives on —  
Item — I Give unto Alexander Hunter one year Rent of the plantation she now lives on —  
Item — I Give five years rent of the plantation Mary Johnson now lives on to the poor of this parish —  
Item — I Give to my Brother Geo. Brett all my Wearing Apparel —  
And it is my Will also that in Case any of my said Children should Die that there part of my Estate to be Equally Divided betwixt the Others —  
Item — I Give unto my Servant Woman Mary Noble Two years of her said servitude —  
It is my Will also that after my Wife has her Rent paid and my Childrens part set aside according to Will and all my Just Debts paid that then the remaining part of my Estate be sold for money or Tobacco and that Distributed to the poor of this parish I Appoint my Brother Geo. Brett to sell the said part of my Estate and pay the proceeds — himself to the said poor —  
I Also Appoint my Wife and my Brother Geo. Brett Jointly Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do appoint the said Geo. Brett as Guardian Over my Children and that the said Geo. Brett shall have liberty to Carry my Children and their Estates — to his Dwelling in Virginia he gives good security to Deliver their Estates to them in (Maryland)

When they arrive at the age of nineteen years and also for his giving them three years schooling as usual at least it is further my Will and desire that my Wife shall keep my Children and their Estates till the Day of her Marriage or the day of her Death which shall happen first—

I acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> Day of October 1743— Rich<sup>d</sup>. Brett

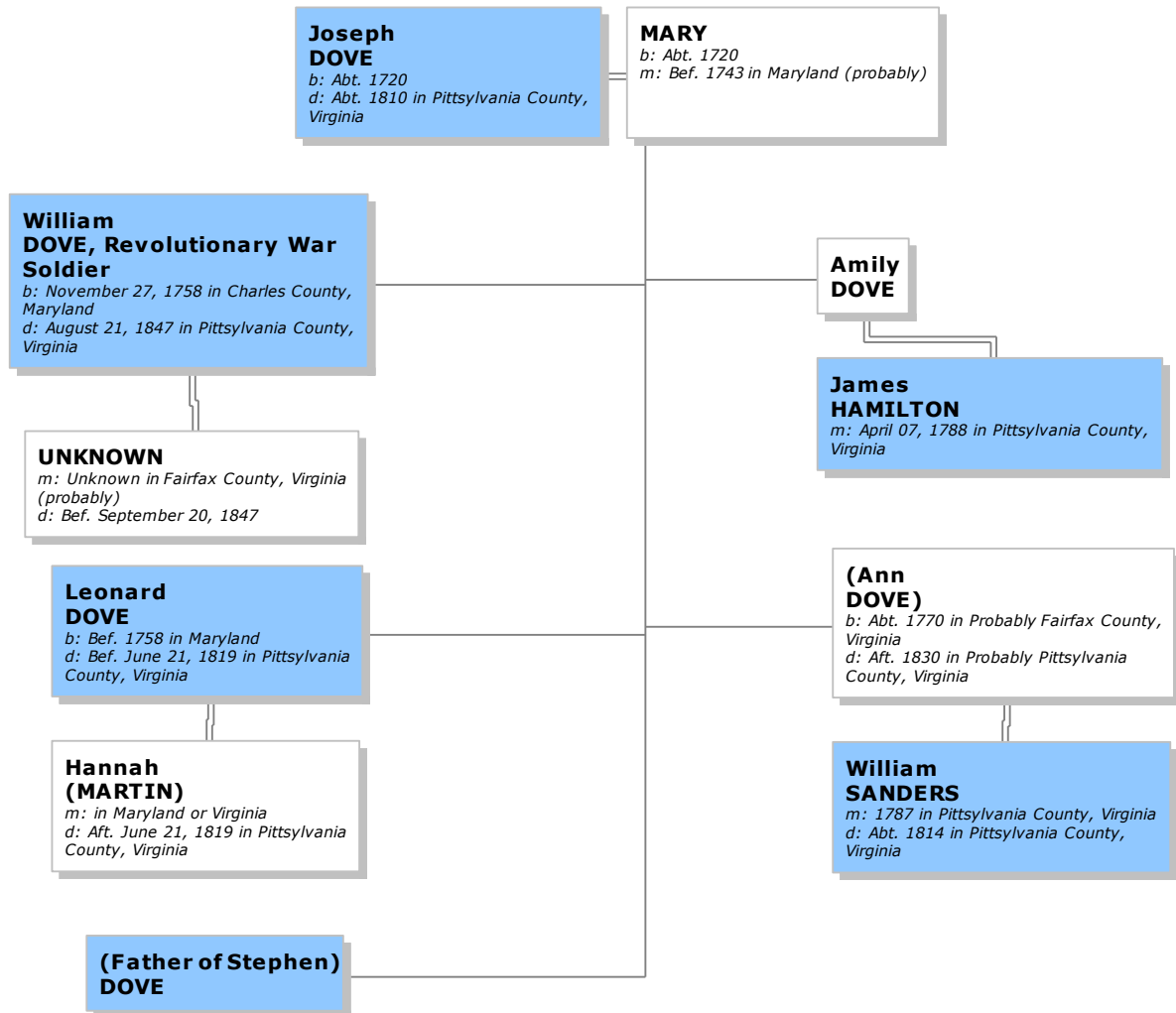
