Hart in the 48th Regiment of Missouri Infantry Volun- teers, in the war of 1861, who died on the 11th day of November A. D. 1864, at Rolla in the State of Missouri caused by Typhoid Pneumonia disease which was contracted or received in the military service of the United States, and in the line of his duty.

She further declares that she was married to the said Isaac Winget on the first day of April A. D. 1840; by Ben Miller, a Justice of the peace, in the County of Green in the State of Pennsylvania

that the names and date of birth of her children under sixteen years at the time of the decease of her said husband, and the place of her residence are as follows, viz:

- Mary E. Winget born Sept. 1st, 1854
- John E. Winget born March 10, 1857

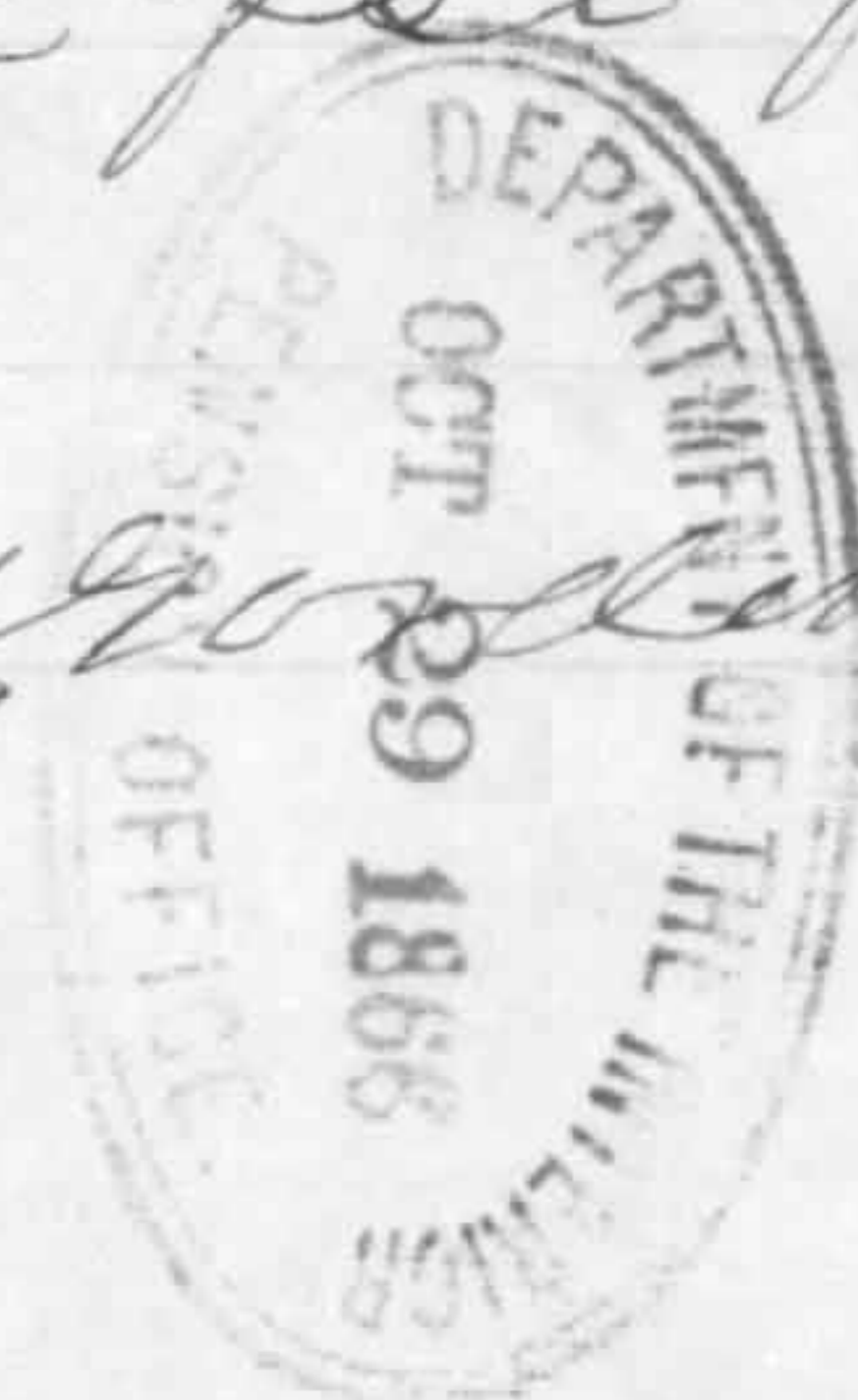
