RESEARCH OBJECTIVE

Who were the parents of Andrew Caylor of Loudoun County, Virginia and did he have a wife and children?

ITEMIZED RESEARCH RESULTS

This is a listing of all documented evidence of Andrew Caylor in Loudoun County, Virginia. This is complete as of Nov 2007 although more information may later be found.

All available deeds, wills, militia service records, chancery court records, census records, vital records, personal property tax records, tithable tax records, and land tax records have been reviewed for the period 1758 – 1850. One group of records that I've not yet examined is the court orders from Loudoun County.

5	11 Mar 1783	The Loudoun court ordered the care of Thomas Virgin, 2 years old in Jan 1783, to Andrew Calor. ⁵	This suggests he may have been married at this time.

15	18 Apr 1789	Andrew Kaylor appeared in the Loudoun County personal property tax list, 1 st Battalion, with two horses. ¹⁵	
16	27 Mar 1790	Andrew Calor appeared in the Loudoun County personal property tax list, 1 st Battalion, with two horses. ¹⁶	
17	17 Mar 1791	Andrew Calor appeared in the Loudoun County personal property tax list, 1 st Battalion, with no tithable listed and two horses. Michael Jenkins resided with him and was tithable. ¹⁷	
18	3 Apr 1792	Andrew Kaylor appeared in the Loudoun County personal property tax list, 1 st Battalion, with two horses. ¹⁸

ANALYSIS OF ITEMIZED RESULTS

Andrew's appearance in the 1779 tithables lists suggests he was born between, say, Apr 1762 and Apr 1763 (April was typically the month for recording tithables).

The 1783 "adoption" of a two-year old and his appearance by himself (or with wife) in the tithables list that year suggest he was 21 by this time – a possible birth date of, say, Apr 1761 – Apr 1762. He was likely married at this time (1783) because of the "adoption" but there is no indication of a wife in any records.

Based on the above, Andrew's proposed birth date is Apr 1762. Note that the use of the tax lists to judge birth dates is inexact and other, supporting, information should be obtained if possible. In Andrew's case, we have no other data.

No male Caylor was listed with Andrew in the personal property tax lists so it's possible he had no son older than 16 by 1802, the last year Andrew appeared; however, tax lists are often misleading in the first appearance of a tithable male. These records also indicate nothing about a female child, which he may have had.

There is no indication of a wife's name in any record although an examination of the land records may provide some clues – it's important to establish whether Andrew was in fact married because Mary Caylor, wife of Jacob Snider, could have been his daughter (more about this in a research report on these two people).
