## Research Objective

Who was father of Mary Dove of Loudoun County, Virginia?

## INFORMATION AVAILABLE

Mary was born 27 Aug 1822 in Fairfax County, Virginia and died 3 May 1887 in Fairfax County. She married Joseph Edwards 10 Feb 1850 in Loudoun County, Virginia and the marriage bond was paid by William Dove. Mary and Joseph had the following children: Laura Virginia (b. 20 Jan 1851) and James William (b. 16 Jun 1853). Her husband died 1 Nov 1858. She lived in Loudoun County through the 1870 census and was in the household of her son, James William Edwards, in Fairfax County during the 1880 census (they lived in the Dranesville area of Fairfax, adjacent to the Loudoun county line).

## PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS

It's possible that the William Dove who paid her marriage bond was her father but he could have been a brother or uncle. An inspection of the indexes for death and estate probate records for Loudoun County shows no William Dove or Mary Dove records. Since there is no direct evidence of Mary's father, an analysis of all records for likely Dove families is needed to develop a "proof" using indirect evidence.

## SUMMARY OF RESEARCH RESULTS

It is most likely that the William Dove who paid the marriage bond for Mary was her brother and that her father (and mother) was deceased by 1840. Mary's father and mother were William and (probably) Mary (—?—) Dove who lived in Fairfax County until 1825-26 when they moved to Loudoun. This William Dove was born 1770-80 and Mary (—?—) was likely born 1780-90.

## ITEMIZED RESEARCH RESULTS

All documented events related to Mary Dove are reported below, as well as events related to her likely brother William. Also reported are the census enumerations for all Dove families in Loudoun and Fairfax counties from 1820 – 1840 as well as censuses for Mary and William in 1850 and later.

### ANALYSIS OF ITEMIZED RESULTS

William Dove 1<sup>st</sup> (labeled “1<sup>st</sup>” to distinguish him from the other William Doves) first appeared in Loudoun County paying personal property taxes in Mar 1826. He then appeared in the 1830 census of Loudoun with an apparent wife, one female child and four male children in the household. He paid personal property taxes each year since 1826, paying last in Mar

1830 – at this point he no longer appears in the records. We see James Dove first appearing in the personal property tax lists in 1832 working for Robert Coe, and Mary Dove 1<sup>st</sup> (to distinguish from later Mary Doves) appearing in 1834. The William Dove who paid taxes in Mar 1831 is likely not William Dove 1<sup>st</sup>, but William Dove 2<sup>nd</sup>, based on the number of horses that William Dove 1<sup>st</sup> possessed, some of which apparently went to Mary Dove 1<sup>st</sup>.

These records are consistent with the death of William Dove 1<sup>st</sup> between Aug 1830 and Mar 1831, and his having a wife named Mary who paid taxes on the horses in 1834 and 1835, the last time she appeared. A closer inspection of the tax lists for 1831-1834 shows no additional entries for Dove families.

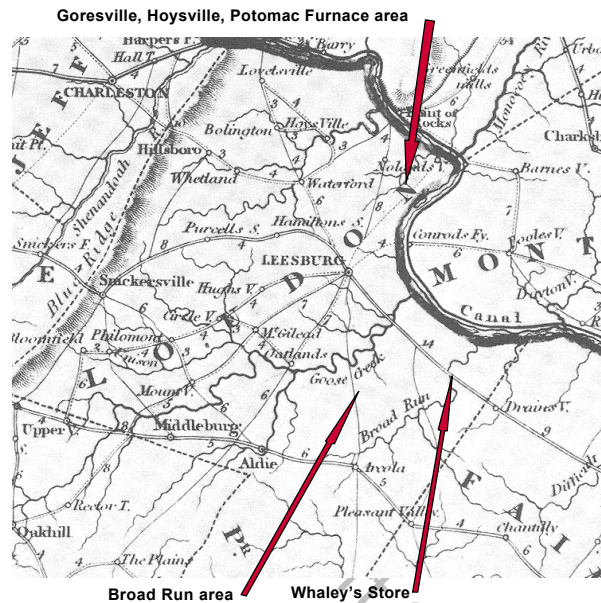
The Loudoun County census records for 1860 luckily show the county of birth – both William Dove 2<sup>nd</sup> and Mary (Dove) Edwards were born in Fairfax. There are two William Dove families in Fairfax in 1820 and none in 1830. One of these two families moved to Loudoun and there is no way to distinguish which one moved based on the census listings. More research in Fairfax records would be needed to understand these two William Dove families. There is also a William Dove family in 1830 Richland County, Ohio that could be one of the Fairfax families – in fact, the Ancestry.com 1830 census index shows nine Wm Dove families in the United States.

In the 1830 Loudoun census William Dove 1<sup>st</sup> had an oldest male child age 20-30, consistent with William Dove 2<sup>nd</sup>, born 1810. He also had an oldest female child age 5-10, consistent with Mary Dove born 27 Aug 1822. Both would have been born in Fairfax County. More evidence of the parent-child relations is in the names – both oldest male and female children were named after the parents (presuming Mary to be the mother of Mary (Dove) Edwards). Furthermore, William Dove 2<sup>nd</sup> had an oldest daughter named Mary.

The younger William Dove 2<sup>nd</sup> appeared in the Loudoun censuses for 1850 and 1860 and the family lived near Whaley's Store post office, located at today's Route 7 and Broad Run creek – this is the southeastern part of Loudoun County adjacent to Fairfax County. A William Dove home appears on the Yardley map of Loudoun<sup>39</sup> in this area.

### SUGGESTIONS FOR FURTHER RESEARCH

Examine probate records of Fairfax in the period 1830-1870 for Thomas Dove, Robert Dove and any other Doves. See if family members are listed.

Examine the land tax records for Loudoun for 1830-1860 to try to explain the 1840 census with 13 slaves in the William Dove household.

Explore the Fairfax records prior to 1830 to attempt to trace the William Dove family that moved to Loudoun in 1825-26 as well as other Dove families.
