Letter from Margaret Cass that refers to her grandmother's Bible and record dates of family members, dated 3 August 1996. Attachment is Hayes research by Flora Jean Aulgur Hargrave with note by Cass that she has not reviewed material for accuracy – includes several photographs (photocopies) and copies of vital records. Date of attachment is not stated but would have been between 1983 and August 1996 – probably in the mid- to late-1980s.

I decided to send you copies of Hayes material sent to me. I don't know how accurate it is because I have not tried to check it.

By the way, you are correct as to the date of death of Margaret Fullmer as 1906. Within the last year I was sent copies of pages from a Bible that was surely my grandmother's. (I'm in it)
The marriage date for Mary Catherine Hayes & Wm Koons is given as Feb. 19, 1874, the birth date of Mary Catherine Hayes as March 3, 1855. I may have hit the wrong keys or misread info. Sorry you have to change your database again.

The Bible lists the birth of Fullmer Adam Hayes as Nov. 17, 1851.

Also in the Bible is info on Clemen(tine) Koons. She was always called Clemen in my memory but was no doubt Clementine because the name is in the Hayes family.

Perhaps I will copy the pages and include them with this letter.

Dear Mother;

I take my pen to write to you once more. I have just received 7 letters and finish reading them.

I left here April 16 for down the river and bin down 3 weeks, was at Blarrisburg two Sunday and to chuoch and had a nice time there. Received a letter from Grandmother Lake, she start on Wensday to Phila to willias and I have wrote to her this Day and I think that I will not see them any more this time for I will be on my way home in side of 3 weeks more and as you are away from home there will be a good feeling to get Kate Hall or Mary Hartman and take them right a long with me and this Thursday May 8, 79 I comence settle with Uncle Wm Hayes and what is your price for that acre lot in Loyds adtions — *His mother - Sarah Jones Land -* and the Price of it if I can sell it for \$375 or \$400 Dollars any way she goes and turn the money over to Uncle Wm and he has a morgage of 800.00 against your folks out there so I will leave the lot at his figers \$375 and take the morgage of \$800 and hold it my self, then that will square the lot buisness and he is a fraid of getting beate out of some of it because it stands in a tickles way. Then you can pay me that when you can get this other money and it makes it square all around. I have received a letter from Willias dated April 27, He talked about buyin a house for 75 Dollars. You write and tell them not be in a hurry and save there money and not let it burn there fingers till they get some and then by that ime I will be there and they must look a grate way further ahead and not be to fast and one help the other and then it will go good and make the one house delived the ice for a wille and you be very carefull with your money because it is in here a scarce artichel. Don't forget and write soon and keep me here on a expense any longer.

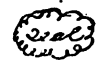
